Discipleship:

All the community are evangelized, but not disciple. So we set up every Wednesday afternoon a discipleship session for the community. There are few participants but we do believe that these few key people will bring impact among their families and friends in few years coming. Transformation is always brought by very few people.



School: Working and Learning

Apart of running normal school, as all of you know, we are pioneering a new education system. We selected 4 girls who have left school because lacking of finances. 50% of their time is used to plant strawberries and the rest is learning Malagasy, French, English and basic Math. They have also time to learn some business skills. This is a real sustainable education project.



Sewing seminar

Each Saturday for 3 months
Clara with my cousin organize
a sewing seminar for the community. Clara is very excited
with the 15 participants. She
can't wait to sew some clothes
for me and her children.

Dry fruits

April & May is the guava season. It is the cheapest one and rich in ascorbic acid (vitamin C), B-complex vitamins and essential oils. Unfortunately, the Malagasy people, especially the rural people dislike this wonderful fruit. They haven't seen the importance of having wild guava. They don't care about it, even cut its trees and destroy them for making charcoal.

When we dry them we add value and people are happy to sell them.
